


Jesus goes into Jerusalem Matthew 21:1-11

I live in a village outside Jerusalem. Nothing much happens here. One day I was with my master when something amazing happened!



I could see some men walking towards me. They looked happy and excited. I don't know why but they made me feel excited too. I couldn't help letting out a little bray.



I got even more excited when I overheard them ask my master if I could come with them! They said to him, "the master needs the donkey colt." I wondered what was going to happen

next?



They excitedly put cloaks on my back, they were getting me ready to be ridden! No one had ever ridden me before. I wondered who was going to ride me and what was going to happen next.



A man got on my back. He was very calm and he said, "Hello, little Donkey. You are going to do an important job today." I felt proud. Lots of people started to crowd around us.



Suddenly, there were huge crowds of people. I got pushed and shoved. The people started to cut down palm branches and wave them. The noise was incredible – I was a bit nervous.



They started to take their cloaks off and put them under my hooves. It felt strange walking on everybody's cloaks. The people were all shouting, "Hosanna, Praise Him who comes in the name of the Lord."



The people were so excited to see Jesus. The noise was deafening. I felt proud and important to be part of such a day. Jesus whispered, "thank you," in my ear and He went to the Temple to pray to God. The people who were welcoming Jesus into the city recognised Jesus as their Saviour. Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem on a donkey colt was prophesied in the Old Testament. He was the Messiah that the people had been waiting for. In the Old Testament, in the book of Zechariah, it talks about a king coming to Jerusalem, a king coming on the back of a donkey! How exciting for our little Donkey! The word Hosanna is a Hebrew word meaning 'Lord Save us.' The people were crying out for a Saviour, someone to save them from the Roman occupation. They knew that Jesus healed people and did miracles. How do you think the people watching this felt? How do you feel when somebody exciting is coming to visit?
