


Pilate lived with 600 Roman soldiers in a great fortress, next to the temple in Jerusalem.


Pilate took Jesus inside and asked Him if He was the king of the Jews. Jesus replied, 'My kingdom is not of this world.'

Thank you so much that you went through all this for me. Thank you that you want to find me when I'm lost and that if I ask you; you will stay with me for ever.




