
Jacob steals a Promise! A promise for a bowl of Soup!

Genesis 25:19-34




This story about twin brothers in the first book of the Bible.


Isaac and Rebekah had twin boys. **Esau had been born first**. As he grew up was very hairy, but Jacob wasn't hairy like his brother!




The twin brothers were different in other ways too. Esau loved to go away hunting venison for his father Isaac's dinner, but Jacob liked staying at home cooking.



Isaac wanted his boys to know about God's promise to their ancestor, Abraham, that their family would have God's special blessings and become great.



'This special blessing to our family, always passes to the eldest son,' said Isaac. Jacob loved hearing about God's special promises and wished he was the eldest son.



One day Esau came home from hunting feeling so hungry that he was nearly fainting. 'Give me some of your red lentil soup,' he said, 'before I die of hunger.'



You can only have it if you give me your special promise from God,' answered Jacob. 'Well, it is no use to me if I die,' Esau replied and he swapped God's promise for a bowl of soup!



After he had eaten, Esau felt much better and he was sorry that he had given away God's special promise, but Jacob treasured having God's special blessing.



Jacob and Esau were different in many ways. I wonder if you have any brothers or sisters. If so, do you think you are different from your brother or your sister too? God made us all unique and special.

Jacob and Esau were twins, but Esau was born first, so he was the oldest. In the past, in many countries like Israel, the first boy would get most of their father's riches, after he died. This meant he would inherit it and get God's special blessing. Esau did not really seem to value God's promise to him as the first-born son. Jacob really wanted that promise for himself. Was Esau right to sell his special promise for a bowl of soup? Was Jacob right to ask him to swap all his father's riches for a bowl of soup? Did Jacob and Esau make good choices?


